General Competition Rules

1. A team is not eligible to compete until the ITC planning committee has received all materials proving eligibility: copies of picture student ID, class schedule, payment, completed registration form, and a signed release form.
2. On the day of the competition, each team member must be an undergraduate student at the university they specified online on the Competitor Registration Form. Members who have graduated during the winter quarter or semester are eligible to participate.
3. Competitors are not required to be a member of MISSA or a registered student at the California State Polytechnic University, Pomona, or a member of a specific major.
4. Substitutes for registered team members are allowed. Substitutions cannot be made after the team checks in on the day of the competition. Each substitute must submit all required proof of eligibility at the time of substitution. The original team member does not need to be present for the substitution to take place. The ITC planning committee must approve the substitution.
5. All competition materials will be composed in English.
6. Team members cannot consult with anyone outside their teams on the day of the competition about the case/business problem.
7. The judges' decisions are final.
8. Cheating results in disqualification.
9. No food or drinks are allowed in the labs.
10. Each team may submit only one solution per problem.
11. The ITC planning committee reserves the right to alter the rules at any time as necessary.
12. All competitors must conduct themselves in a professional manner.
13. Contestants will be photographed and/or videotaped. MISSA reserves the right to use the photographs for future IT Competition publicity.
14. Professional attire is mandatory. All competitors must be prepared for a formal and professional atmosphere.
15. Any illegal attempt to influence the judges is not allowed.
16. The registration fee is non-refundable.

The rules and guidelines appear in no particular order of importance. The Information Technology Competition (ITC) planning committee who created these rules reserves the right to modify these rules at any time. Competing teams will receive notification of changes to these rules should there be any.
